1 About this user guide

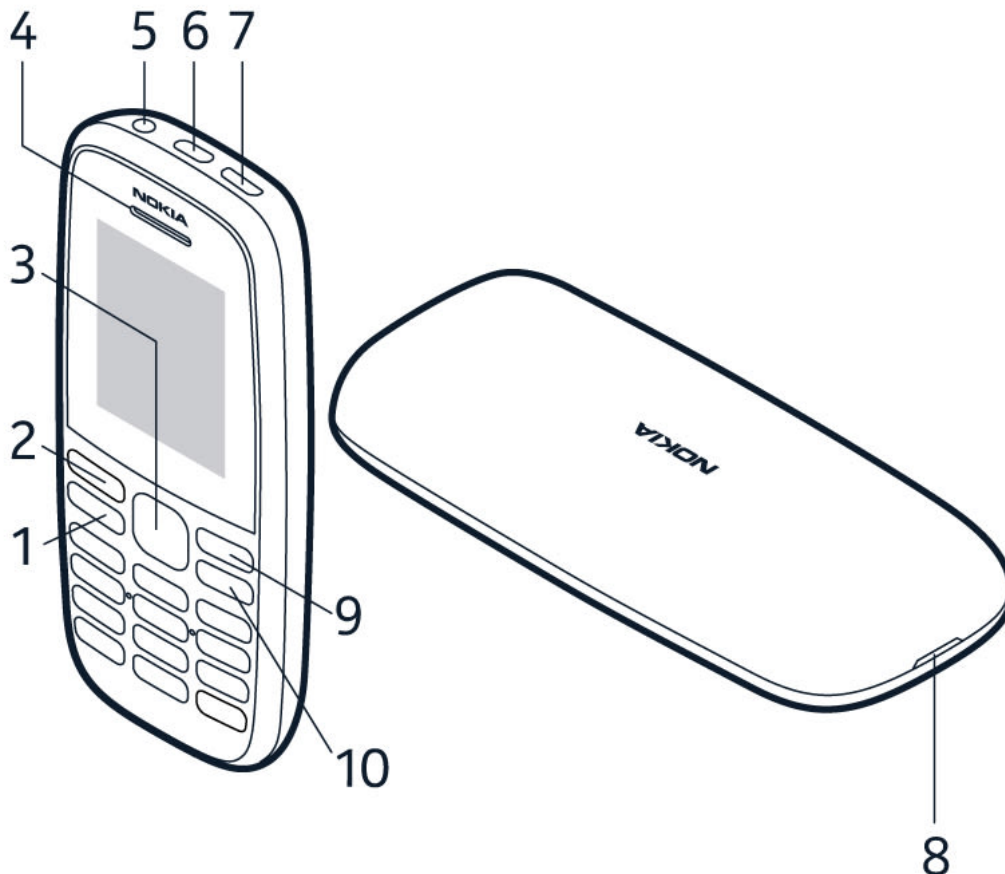


Important: For important information on the safe use of your device and battery, read “Product and safety information” before you take the device into use. To find out how to get started with your new device, read the user guide.

2 Get started

KEYS AND PARTS

Your phone



This user guide applies to the following models: TA-1174, TA-1299, TA-1304.

Avoid touching the antenna area while the antenna is in use. Contact with aerials affects the communication quality and may reduce battery life because of higher power levels during operation.

Do not connect to products that create an output signal, as this may damage the device. Do not connect any voltage source to the audio connector. If you connect an external device or headset, other than those approved for use with this device, to the audio connector, pay special attention to the volume levels. Parts of the device are magnetic. Metallic materials may be attracted to the device. Do not place credit cards or other magnetic storage media near the device, because info stored on them may be erased.

Some of the accessories mentioned in this user guide, such as charger, headset, or data cable, may be sold separately.

SET UP AND SWITCH ON YOUR PHONE

Mini SIM

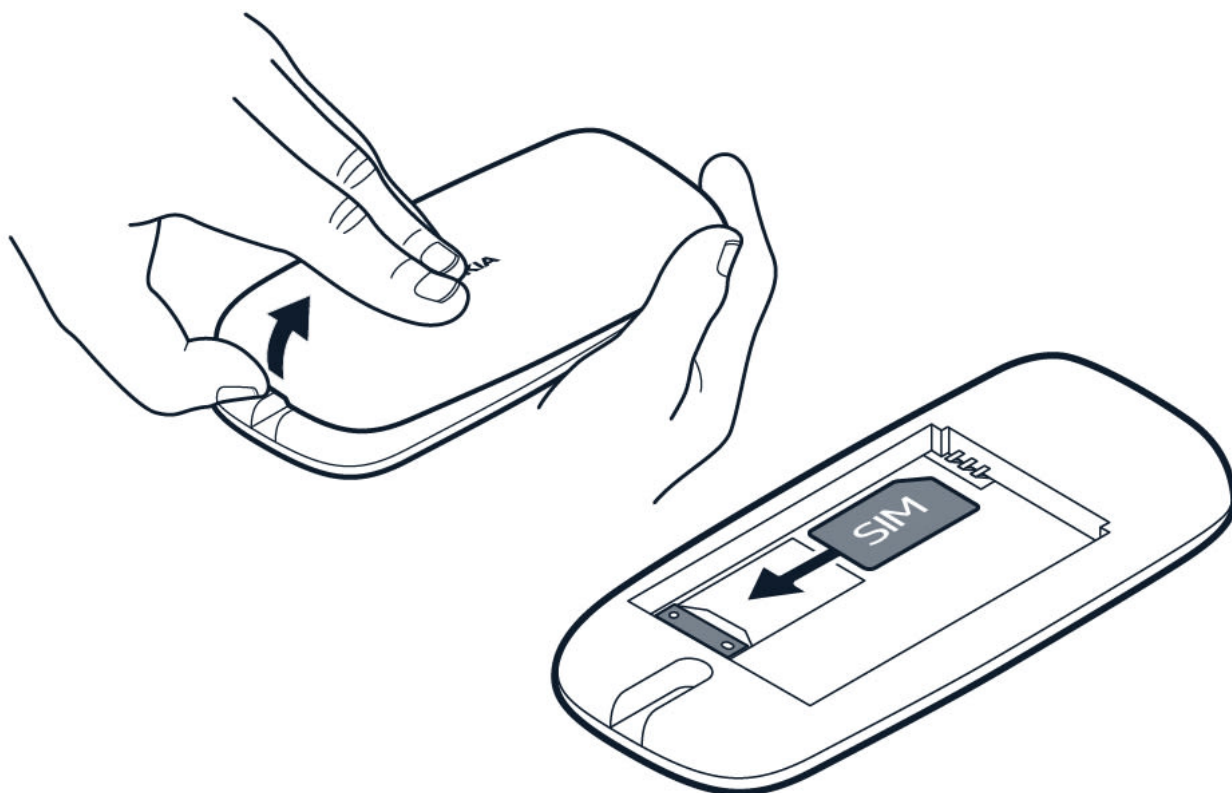


Important: This device is designed to be used with a mini SIM card only. Use of incompatible SIM cards may damage the card or the device and may corrupt data stored on the card.



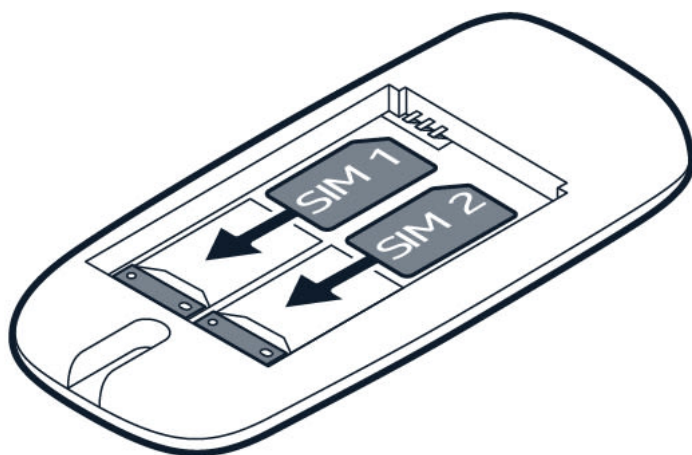
Note: Switch the device off and disconnect the charger and any other device before removing any covers. Avoid touching electronic components while changing any covers. Always store and use the device with any covers attached.

Insert the SIM card



1. Place your fingernail in the small slot at the bottom of the phone, then lift and remove the cover.
2. If the battery is in the phone, lift it out.
3. Slide the SIM card into the SIM slot with the contact area face down.

Insert the second SIM



1. If you have a dual-SIM phone, slide the second SIM in the SIM2 slot. Both SIM cards are available at the same time when the device is not being used, but while one SIM card is active, for example, when making a call, the other may be unavailable.
2. Line up the battery contacts and put the battery in.
3. Put back the back cover.



Tip: To find out if your phone can use 2 SIM cards, see the label on the sales box. If there are 2 IMEI codes on the label, you have a dual-SIM phone.

Switch on your phone

Press and hold .

CHARGE YOUR PHONE

Your battery has been partially charged at the factory, but you may need to recharge it before you can use your phone.

Charge the battery

1. Plug the charger into a wall outlet.
2. Connect the charger to the phone. When done, unplug the charger from the phone and then from the wall outlet.

If the battery is completely discharged, it may take several minutes before the charging indicator is displayed.



Tip: You can use USB charging when a wall outlet is not available. The efficiency of USB charging power varies significantly and it may take a long time for charging to start and the device to start functioning.

KEYPAD

Use the phone keys

- To see your phone's apps and features, select **Menu** on the home screen.
- To go to an app or feature, press the scroll key up, down, left, or right. To open an app or feature, press the scroll key.

Lock the keypad

To avoid accidentally pressing the keys, lock the keypad: select **Go to** > **Lock keypad**. To unlock the keypad, press the end key and select **Unlock**.

Switch on the torch

On the home screen, quickly scroll up twice to switch on the torch.

To switch off the torch, scroll up once.

Do not shine the light in anyone's eyes.

Write with the keypad

Press a key repeatedly until the letter is shown.

To type in a space press **0**.

To type in a special character or punctuation mark, select **Opt.** > **Insert options** > **Insert symbol**.

To switch between character cases, press **#** repeatedly.

To type in a number, press and hold a number key.

3 Calls, contacts, and messages

CALLS

Make a call

Learn how to make a call with your new phone.

1. Type in the phone number. To type in the + character, used for international calls, press * twice.
2. Press the call key. If asked, select which SIM to use.
3. To end the call, press the end key.


Answer a call

Press .


CONTACTS

Add a contact

Save and organise your friends' phone numbers.


1. Select **Menu** >  > **Add contact**.
2. Select where you want to save it, on **Phone** or **SIM card**.
3. Write the name and type in the number.
4. Select **OK**.

Save a contact from call log

1. Select **Menu** >  > **Missed calls**, **Received calls**, or **Dialled numbers** depending on from where you want to save the contact.
2. Highlight the number you want to save, select **Opt.** > **Save**, and select where you want to save the contact.
3. Add the contact's name, check that the phone number is correct, and select **OK**.


Call a contact

You can call a contact directly from the contacts list.

1. Select **Menu** >  > **Names** and scroll to a contact you want to call.
2. Select the contact and press the call key.

SEND MESSAGES

Write and send messages

1. Select **Menu** >  > **Create message**.
2. Write a message on the message field.
3. Select **Opt.** > **Send**, to add a recipient. You can enter a phone number or add a recipient by selecting **Search** to open **Contacts**.
4. Select **OK**.

Writing options

You can find different options for writing a message under **Opt.** when you are in the message field. You can, for example, insert symbols and save messages.

To switch on predictive text, select **Opt.** > **Dictionary**.

4 Personalise your phone

CHANGE YOUR RING OR MESSAGE TONE

You can choose a new ringtone or message tone.

Change your ringtone

1. Select **Menu** > **⚙️** > **Tone settings**.
2. Choose **Ringtone**.
3. Scroll to a ringtone.
4. Press **OK**.



Tip: Is your ringtone too loud or too silent? Select **Ring volume** and scroll left or right.

Change your message tones

1. Select **Menu** > **⚙️** > **Tone settings**.
2. Scroll to a **Message alert tone**.
3. Select the tone you want to use and select **OK**.

CHANGE THE LOOK OF YOUR HOME SCREEN

Change the look of your home screen with display settings.


Choose a new wallpaper

You can change the background of your home screen with the **Wallpaper** setting.

1. Select **Menu** > **⚙️** > **Display settings** > **Wallpaper**.
2. Select the wallpaper and then the option to position the wallpaper on the screen.

Show date and time

You can choose if you want to see the date and time on the home screen of your phone.

1. Select **Menu** >  > **Time settings** > **Display of time and date**.
2. Select **Show clock** to have them visible on the home screen.

If you want your phone to have time updated automatically, set **Auto-update of date and time** to **On**.


PROFILES

Your phone has different profiles for different situations. You can edit the profiles to your liking.

Personalise profiles

There are several profiles that you can use in different situations. There is, for example, a silent profile for when you cannot have sounds on and an outdoor profile with loud tones.

You can personalise profiles further.

1. Select **Menu** >  > **Profiles**.
2. Select a profile and **Personalise**.

For each profile, you can set a specific ringtone, ringtone volume, message sounds and so on.




Tip: You can add different profiles to **Go to** menu for quick access.

SETTINGS FOR GO TO

You can add quick links to different applications and settings to **Go to**.

Edit Go to settings

On the bottom left of the home screen, you have **Go to**, and when you select it, you can quickly access different applications and settings. You can change the applications and settings to your liking.


1. Select **Menu** >  > **Go to settings**.
2. Select **Select options**.
3. Scroll to a shortcut you want to add on the **Go to** list on the home screen and **Mark** them.
4. Select **Done** to exit the list and **Yes** to save changes.

You can also reorganise your **Go to** list.

1. Select **Organise**.
2. Scroll to an item you want to move and select **Move**.
3. Select if you want to move it up, down, to top, or to bottom of the list.
4. Select **Back** to exit the list and **OK** to save changes.

PERSONALISE YOUR SIM CARDS

Edit the SIM card settings


1. Select **Menu** >  > **Dual SIM settings**.
2. Select **SIM name** and enter a name for your SIM card.
3. Select an icon for the SIM card.

5 Radio

FIND AND SAVE RADIO STATIONS


Connect a compatible headset. It acts as an antenna.

Find your favourite radio stations

1. Select **Menu** > .
2. When the phone asks if you want to search all available channels, select **OK**.
3. To switch between stations, scroll up or down.
4. To save a found channel, select **Opt.** > **Save channel**.

LISTEN TO RADIO


Listen to your favourite radio stations

Select **Menu** > . To change the volume, scroll left or right. To listen to the radio using the loudspeaker, select **Opt.** > **Loudspeaker**. Keep the headset connected. To close the radio, select **Switch off**.

6 Clock, calendar, and calculator


SET THE TIME AND DATE MANUALLY

Change the time and date

1. Select **Menu** >  > **Time settings**.
2. Switch **Auto-update of date and time** to **Off**.
3. To set the time, scroll down, and select **Clock** > **Set the time**. Use the scroll key to set the time and select **OK**.
4. To set the date, scroll down, and select **Date setting**. Use the scroll key to set the date and select **OK**.


ALARM CLOCK

Set an alarm

1. Select **Menu** >  > **Set alarms**.
2. Select an alarm.
3. To set the hour, scroll up or down. To set the minutes, scroll right and then up or down.
4. Select **OK**.

CALENDAR


Add a calendar reminder

1. Select **Menu** > .
2. Select a date and **Opt.** > **Add reminder**.
3. Type in a name for the event and select **OK**.
4. To set an alarm, select **Alarm on**. To set the hour, scroll up or down. To set the minutes, scroll right and then up or down.
5. Select **OK**.

CALCULATOR

Learn how to add, subtract, multiply, and divide with your phone's calculator.

How to calculate

1. Select **Menu** > .
2. Enter the first factor of your calculation, use the scroll key to select the operation, and enter the second factor.
3. Select **Equals** to get the result of the calculation.

Select **Clear** to empty the number fields.




7 Erase your phone's data

REMOVE PRIVATE CONTENT FROM YOUR PHONE

If you buy a new phone, or otherwise want to dispose of or recycle your phone, here's how you can remove your personal information and content. Note that it is your responsibility to remove all private content.

Remove content from your phone

When removing private content from your phone, pay attention to whether you are removing content from the phone memory or the SIM card.

1. To remove messages, select **Menu** >  > **Delete messages**. Select from the available options the messages you want to delete.
2. To remove contacts, select **Menu** >  > **Delete**, and select if you want to delete contacts **One by one** or **Delete all**.
3. To remove your call information, select **Menu** >  > **Delete recent call lists**, and select **All**.
4. Check that all your personal content has been removed.

RESTORE FACTORY SETTINGS


You can restore factory settings in this setting. Be careful, however, since you lose all personalisation and all data you have added on the phone.

Reset your phone

Accidents may happen and your phone may stop responding. You can restore the original factory settings, but be careful, since this reset removes all data you have saved in the phone memory and all your personalisation.

If you are disposing your phone, note that you are responsible of removing all private content.

You need to have the security code to restore the original settings. To reset your phone to its original settings and to remove all of your data, on the home screen, type in ***#7370#**.

1. Select **Menu** >  > **Restore factory settings**.
2. Enter the security code. There is no more confirmation after you select **OK**, but the phone is reset and all data is removed.

8 Product and safety information

FOR YOUR SAFETY

SWITCH OFF IN RESTRICTED AREAS



Switch the device off when mobile device use is not allowed or when it may cause interference or danger, for example, in aircraft, in hospitals, or near medical equipment, fuel, chemicals, or blasting areas. Obey all instructions in restricted areas.

ROAD SAFETY COMES FIRST



Obey all local laws. Always keep your hands free to operate the vehicle while driving. Your first consideration while driving should be road safety.

All wireless devices may be susceptible to interference, which could affect performance.

AUTHORISED SERVICE



Only authorised personnel may install or repair this product.

BATTERIES, CHARGERS, AND OTHER ACCESSORIES



Use only batteries, chargers and other accessories approved by HMD Global Oy for use with this device. Do not connect incompatible products.

KEEP YOUR DEVICE DRY



If your device is water-resistant, see its IP rating in the device's technical specifications for more detailed guidance.

PROTECT YOUR HEARING



To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods. Exercise caution when holding your device near your ear while the loudspeaker is in use.

SAR



This device meets RF exposure guidelines when used either in the normal use position against the ear or when positioned at least 1.5 centimetres (5/8 inch) away from the body. EMERGENCY CALLS

 **Important:** Connections in all conditions cannot be guaranteed. Never rely solely on any wireless phone for essential communications like medical emergencies.

Before making the call:

- Switch the phone on.
- If the phone screen and keys are locked, unlock them.
- Move to a place with adequate signal strength.

To place an emergency call on any screen, press key number 5 for 4 seconds.

1. Press the end key repeatedly, until the home screen is shown.
2. Type in the official emergency number for your present location. Emergency call numbers vary by location.
3. Press the call key.
4. Give the necessary information as accurately as possible. Do not end the call until given permission to do so.

You may also need to do the following:

- Put a SIM card in the phone.
- If your phone asks for a PIN code, type in the official emergency number for your present location, and press the call key.
- Switch off the call restrictions on your phone, such as call barring, fixed dialling, or closed user group.

TAKE CARE OF YOUR DEVICE

Handle your device, battery, charger, and accessories with care. The following suggestions help you keep your device operational.

- Keep the device dry. Precipitation, humidity, and all types of liquids or moisture can contain minerals that corrode electronic circuits.
- Do not use or store the device in dusty or dirty areas.
- Do not store the device in high temperatures. High temperatures may damage the device or battery.
- Do not store the device in cold temperatures. When the device warms to its normal temperature, moisture can form inside the device and damage it.
- Do not open the device other than as instructed in the user guide.
- Unauthorised modifications may damage the device and violate regulations governing radio devices.
- Do not drop, knock, or shake the device or the battery. Rough handling can break it.
- Only use a soft, clean, dry cloth to clean the surface of the device.
- Do not paint the device. Paint can prevent proper operation.
- Keep the device away from magnets or magnetic fields.
- To keep your important data safe, store it in at least two separate places, such as your device, memory card, or computer, or write down important information.

During extended operation, the device may feel warm. In most cases, this is normal. To avoid getting too warm, the device may automatically slow down, close apps, switch off charging, and if necessary, switch itself off. If the device is not working properly, take it to the nearest authorised service facility.

RECYCLE



Always return your used electronic products, batteries, and packaging materials to dedicated collection points. This way you help prevent uncontrolled waste disposal and promote the recycling of materials. Crossed-out wheelie bin symbol



The crossed-out wheelie-bin symbol on your product, battery, literature or packaging reminds you that all electrical and electronic products and batteries must be taken to separate collection at the end of their working life. BATTERY AND CHARGER INFORMATION

Battery and charger safety information

To unplug a charger or an accessory, hold and pull the plug, not the cord.

When your charger is not in use, unplug it. If left unused, a fully charged battery will lose its charge over time.

Always keep the battery between 59°F and 77°F (15°C and 25°C) for optimal performance. Extreme temperatures reduce the capacity and lifetime of the battery. A device with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily. Accidental short-circuiting can happen when a metallic object touches the metal strips on the battery. This may damage the battery or the other object.

Do not dispose of batteries in a fire as they may explode. Obey local regulations. Recycle when possible. Do not dispose as household waste.

Do not dismantle, cut, crush, bend, puncture, or otherwise damage the battery in any way. If a battery leaks, do not let the liquid touch the skin or eyes. If this happens, immediately flush the affected areas with water or seek medical help. Do not modify, attempt to insert foreign objects into the battery, or immerse or expose it to water or other liquids. Batteries may explode if damaged.

Use the battery and charger for their intended purposes only. Improper use or use of unapproved or incompatible batteries or chargers may present a risk of fire, explosion, or other hazard, and may invalidate any approval or warranty. If you believe the battery or charger is damaged, take it to a service centre or your phone dealer before continuing to use it. Never use a damaged battery or charger. Only use the charger indoors. Do not charge your device during a lightning storm.

SMALL CHILDREN

Your device and its accessories are not toys. They may contain small parts. Keep them out of the reach of small children.

MEDICAL DEVICES

Operation of radio transmitting equipment, including wireless phones, may interfere with inadequately shielded medical devices' function. Consult a physician or the medical device's manufacturer to determine if it is adequately shielded from external radio energy.

IMPLANTED MEDICAL DEVICES

To avoid potential interference, manufacturers of implanted medical devices (such as cardiac pacemakers, insulin pumps, and neurostimulators) recommend a minimum separation of 15.3 centimeters (6 inches) between a wireless device and the medical device. Persons who have such devices should:

- Always keep the wireless device more than 15.3 centimeters (6 inches) from the medical device.
- Not carry the wireless device in a breast pocket.
- Hold the wireless device to the ear opposite the medical device.
- Switch the wireless device off if there is

any reason to suspect that interference is taking place.

- Follow the manufacturer directions for the implanted medical device.

If you have any questions about using your wireless device with an implanted medical device, consult your health care provider.

HEARING



Warning: When you use the headset, your ability to hear outside sounds may be affected. Do not use the headset where it can endanger your safety.

Some wireless devices may interfere with some hearing aids.

PROTECT YOUR DEVICE FROM HARMFUL CONTENT

VEHICLES

Radio signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in vehicles. For more info, check with the manufacturer of your vehicle or its equipment. Switch your device off in potentially explosive environments, such as near gasoline pumps. Sparks may cause an explosion or fire resulting in injury or death. Note restrictions in areas with fuel; chemical plants; or where blasting operations are in progress. Areas with a potentially explosive environment may not be clearly marked. These usually are areas where you are advised to switch your engine off, below deck on boats, chemical transfer or storage facilities, and where the air contains chemicals or particles. Check with the manufacturers of vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane) if this device can be safely used in their vicinity.

CERTIFICATION INFORMATION

This mobile device meets guidelines for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves (radio frequency electromagnetic fields), recommended by international guidelines from the independent scientific organisation, ICNIRP. These guidelines incorporate substantial safety margins that are intended to assure the protection of all persons regardless of age and health. The exposure guidelines are based on the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR), which is an expression of the amount of radio frequency (RF) power deposited in the head or body when the device is transmitting. The ICNIRP SAR limit for mobile devices is 2.0 W/kg averaged over 10 grams of tissue.

SAR tests are carried out with the device in standard operating positions, transmitting at its highest certified power level, in all its frequency bands.

This device meets RF exposure guidelines when used against the head or when positioned at least $\frac{5}{8}$ inches (1.5 centimetres) away from the body. When a carry case, belt clip, or other form of device holder is used for body-worn operation, it should not contain metal and should provide at least the above stated separation distance from the body.

To send data or messages, a good connection to the network is needed. Sending may be delayed until such a connection is available. Follow the separation distance instructions until the sending is finished.

During general use, the SAR values are usually well below the values stated above. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimise interference on the network, the operating power of your mobile device is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the call. The lower the power output, the lower the SAR value.

Device models may have different versions and more than one value. Component and design changes may occur over time and some changes could affect SAR values.

For more information, go to www.sar-tick.com. Note that mobile devices may be transmitting even if you are not making a voice call.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) has stated that current scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions when using mobile devices. If you are

interested in reducing your exposure, they recommend you limit your usage or use a hands-free kit to keep the device away from your head and body.
